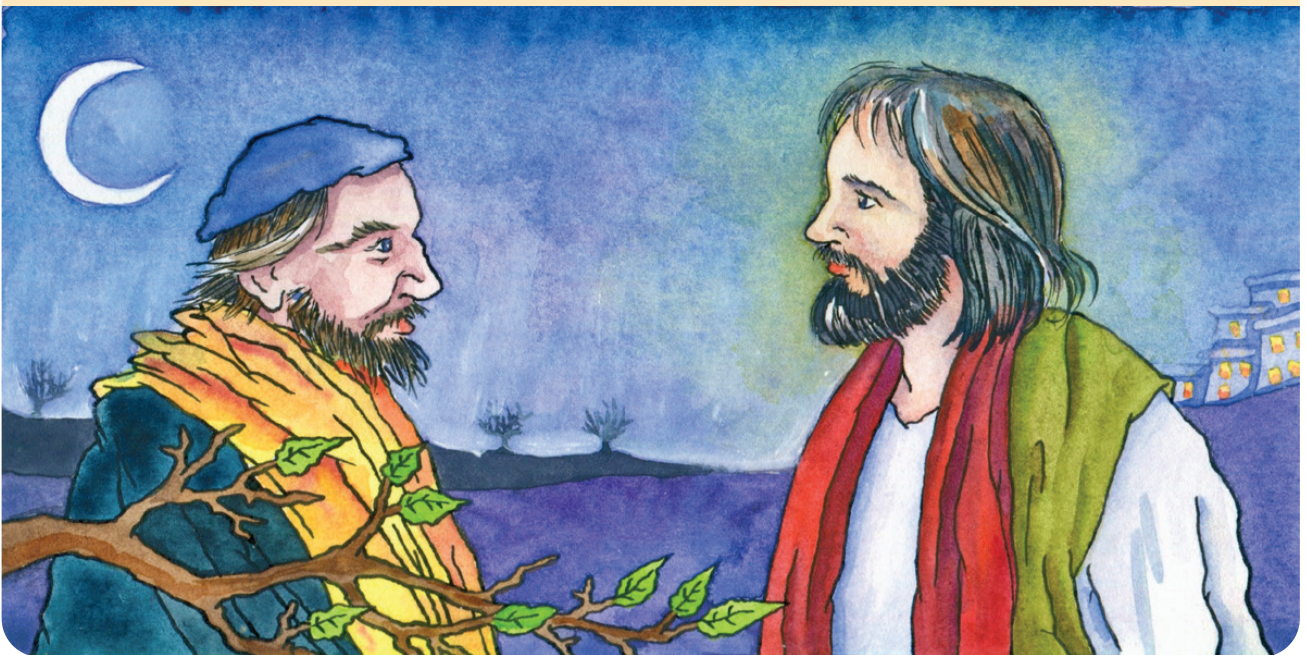
LENT – NOTICING GREEN SHOOTS
